In dogs, clinical signs typically begin within an hour of ingestion. Because THC is stored in the body's fat deposits, the effects of marijuana ingestion can last for days.

Activated charcoal is a liquid material used in the treatment of poisoning. Activated charcoal is given orally and as it passes from one end to the other, toxins are trapped in the charcoal so that when the charcoal passes from the patient, the toxins pass, too. This technique of detoxification may be used in the treatment of marijuana toxicity.

Fluid support and keeping the patient warm may also be needed in treatment. If the patient has lost consciousness, the more intense observation and support is needed.

The chance of fatality is statistically small but possible.
